Juliette Wells, Professor of Literary Studies at Goucher College, Maryland, is a scholar, teacher, and writer who is passionately committed to helping readers of all backgrounds connect with literature, and who brings her groundbreaking research on Jane Austen to audiences around the world. In summer 2025, The Morgan Library & Museum in New York City will celebrate the year of Austen's 250th birthday with an exhibition guest co-curated by Dr. Wells. "A Lively Mind: Jane Austen at 250" will illuminate Austen's authorship and her American reception by presenting manuscripts from the Morgan in the context of major loans from institutions including Jane Austen's House in Chawton, England.

"A Lively Mind" takes inspiration from Dr. Wells's trio of books on Austen's readers and fans, most recently *A New Jane Austen: How Americans Brought Us the World's Greatest Novelist* (Bloomsbury Academic, 2023). *Reading Austen in America* (2017) offers a vivid account of how an appreciative audience for Austen's novels originated and developed in America, and how American readers contributed to the rise of Austen's international fame. *Everybody's Jane: Austen in the Popular Imagination* (2011) explores the importance of Austen to readers and fans today.

2025 will see the publication of Dr. Wells's new reader-friendly edition of Austen's novel *Mansfield Park*, which joins her 200th-anniversary editions of *Persuasion* (2017) and *Emma* (2015). Dr. Wells's more than thirty-five articles and book chapters include examinations of Austen's novels and adaptations, as well as essays on Austen pedagogy. An acclaimed speaker to popular and scholarly audiences, she was a guest on <u>Jane Austen & Co.'s spring 2021 "Race and the</u> <u>Regency" series</u> and regularly gives lectures to Austen societies and other reading groups. **Janet Saidi** is the long-form audio producer at KBIA, the a National Public Radio-member station in Columbia, Missouri; and she serves on the Missouri School of Journalism's faculty and graduate faculty. Janet's many and varied media projects are about building community through audio. She has written and produced pieces for NPR, PBS, the BBC, the *Christian Science Monitor*, and the *Los Angeles Times*, and she spent seven years leading KBIA's award-winning news team.

Her most recent projects include KBIA's podcast *Cover Story with Stephanie Shonekan*; she hosted KBIA's live, national-award-winning talk show *The Check-In*; and she has co-created two award-winning, collaboratively-produced series combining oral history with audio journalism, *You Don't Say* and *Missouri on Mic*. In 2014 and 2016, Janet co-produced two journalism-on-the-stage theater productions with playwright Michelle Tyrene Johnson: *Justice in the Embers*, with Kansas City's Living Room Theatre, and *The Green Duck Lounge* with MU Theatre. Janet began her public-media work at KPBS in San Diego, on a live, nightly talk show called The Lounge. While in California, Janet helped produce the national PBS series "Remaking American Medicine" about healthcare in America, and worked as an editor at the *Gay & Lesbian Times* and *Uptown Newsmagazine*.

As vice president for news at Kansas City Public Television, Janet led a team of multiplatform journalists to launch KCPT's digital magazine *FlatlandKC*, and co-produced the *Beyond Belief* interfaith journalism project for AIR's Localore "Finding America" series. Janet lived for several years in England, where she earned her master's in Literature from University College, London.

Renata Dennis is an Army brat, having lived mostly along the US East Coast and South until her father was reassigned to Germany, where she graduated from Stuttgart American High School. She holds degrees in biology, nursing, and public health from Wheaton College (Illinois) and Emory University. She also has a German Language proficiency certificate from the University of Marburg, Germany.

Early in her career as a nurse, Renata worked in the pediatric subspecialties of hematology-oncology, public health, medical-surgical, and emergency care. Renata recently retired after 24 years as a clinical research nurse, research nurse supervisor, and continuing education instructor and training coordinator from the School of Medicine at Emory University.

She is a member of North Avenue Presbyterian Church (NAPC) in Atlanta, Georgia, and has been on the boards of the Atlanta Children's Shelter, the Samaritan Counseling Center, and the Wheaton College Advisory Council.

Renata is currently the Georgia Regional Coordinator and at-large Board Member for the Jane Austen Society of North America (JASNA). She is Chair of the JASNA DEI Committee. During her tenure, the Committee has contributed to the Society's Diversity and Community Guidelines Statements, selection of the Ombudsperson, creation of the Jane Austen Book Box Program, and most recently, revision of its Bylaws. She has also been a presenter at JASNA's Annual General Meeting and other JASNA and Austen-related events.

In addition to all things Jane Austen, Renata is a peony-obsessed gardener who enjoys good books, baking, long walks, period movies, travel, and visiting the great art museums of the world. **Tia A. Smith**, an award-winning executive producer and consultant, is one of the most sought-after creatives in the industry, continually developing culturally shifting projects that leave lasting imprints. Known for spearheading and identifying commercially marketable projects, Smith is a rare creative whose work spans digital, independent, corporate, scripted and unscripted television, film, development/current production, and live events.

Recently, she received the Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award & Medal from President Joe Biden for her service, creativity, and innovation. Smith was given the Trail Blazer Award from the African American Women in Cinema (AAWIC), and a Proclamation from the City of New York and a "Day of Recognition" honoring her artistic contributions. Ms. Smith is a National Member-At-Large within the Producers Guild of America, and was selected to represent the guild as a speaker at the United Nations' "Commission on the Status of Women: The Role of the Producer" Summit.

As a leading value agent, she has produced over 3500+ hours of television and film including 15 movies, two documentaries, four major awards shows, five national commercial campaigns, serves as a judge for the Emmys, New York Film Festivals, NAACP Image Awards; and sits on the national board of directors for the Gospel Music Association and the Recording Academy/Grammys (Vice President - DC Chapter), respectively.

Smith is the owner of talentedSOL Productions which specializes in developing, consulting, and producing compelling, cultural content to studios, streaming services, and networks domestically and internationally. <u>www.talentedsol.com</u>

Charlotte Northeast (she/her) is an actor, director, educator, and writer. She is a two-time Barrymore Award winner for her work at InterAct and Lantern Theater Company. As a deviser, she has co-created *You Shouldn't Be Doing What You're Doing On That Ladder* with Peter Nicholls (Tribe of Fools) and *Citrus Andronicus* (PAC). As part of the team that created *The Complete Works of Jane Austen, Abridged* and a brand-new adaptation of *Jane Eyre*, she has had the pleasure of appearing in both after which she received a Barrymore Nomination for her portrayal as Jane and a Connecticut Critics Circle Best Actress Nomination for *The Complete Works of Jane Austen, Abridged*.

With 100th Meridian (a company she co-founded), she has toured her solo show *They've All Gone & We'll Go Too* in Philadelphia and the Edinburgh Fringe.
